



SWIFTS & KINGFISHERS JOINT COLONY REPORT – 2020/2021

Swifts and Kingfishers Beavers at 1st Woosehill have, despite the restrictions, enjoyed a varied and of course fun set of activities over the past 12 months. Both colonies' numbers dipped significantly through the course of the pandemic, but numbers are now growing, to 15 Swifts and 12 Kingfishers and plans to expand back up to pre-pandemic numbers of 20 per colony in the next term or so.

To ensure all Beavers are getting the same opportunities and experiences, the colonies combined resources for two terms of Zoom meetings and following a return to face to face in April 2021 have once again adopted the practice of mirroring the same programme each term. Summer term saw the return to face to face for our Beavers, many of who had never experienced Beavers in person before. Our action-packed sessions have seen the Beavers make bug hotels, get sporty and active, plant pumpkins, learn how to put up (and take down) tents and will conclude with a highly anticipated trip up the Thames via Katakanu at the end of term.

As always, Beavers are rewarded for working towards a variety of badges which this year included: Camp Craft, Gardener, Builder, Health and Fitness, Space, Animal Friend: Activity badges. Hike, Air Activities and Time on the Water: Staged badges; and My World, My Outdoors and Teamwork badges: Challenge Badges.

We look forward to embarking on camps when restrictions allow and have a number of enthusiastic Beavers who are keen and excited to experience camping, many for the first time.
